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## \*\*\* GREAT NEW STUFF \*\*\*

How lucky knitters and crocheters are, to have a pasttime that brings us such tranquility and pleasure! Summer will soon start to drift away, and stitchers' thoughts will turn toward holiday gifting and the newest trends for fall. Here's what's new, what's now, what's happening -- the colors will delight your eyes and the fibers will dance through your fingers...

Knitscene Fall 2009 (\$7.99) is a knitter's issue with touches of crochet. The designs are fashion-forward, contemporary and spot-on with fall's latest looks and graphic elements -- simple, stylish and spirited. More importantly, the knitting is fabulous. And wearable. There are 29 must-make knits, including nifty cables (always our personal fave), alluring lace (yes, for fall and winter), unexpected directions and crisp textures. The essential silhouettes include casual but chic hoodies, vests, and scarves combining line, color, stitch and motif in bold ways. Kathy's caterpillar-stitch deep V-neck pullover is among the designs (shown upper left): "Deep 3X3 ribbing and a plunging mini-shawl collar provide a dramatic framework for this textured pullover. The stitch detail features an allover horizontal half-brioche caterpillar. Kathy chose a soft, drapey, worsted weight yarn with a hint of sparkle (Nashua Handknits 'lvy')". We also love the rugby pocket scarf with pockets hanging on each front and a narrow ribbed "seaman's" style neck to reduce bulk. We also recommend the article on reading lace charts, a tutorial well worth the read...

Knit Simple Fall 2009 (\$6.99) answers the question on every knitter's mind, "What's the new hot accessory?" Here's a hint. The "neck's best thing" is smaller than you'd expect. It's the mini-scarf -- short, easy and sweet -- to knit up in a flash! While this season's scarves lack length, they have panache to spare. Many of the ideas in this issue are one-skein wonders. Cowl, scarflet, warmer, mobius, hood: whatever you call it, it takes just a little bit of yarn, so an impulse splurge won't break the bank. There are also great kids sweaters, wear-to-work cardies with plus sizing and the cutest little baby hat by Nicky Epstein using a variety of organic yarns. All in all, quite an impressive issue...

BERROCO "Sundae" (\$9.25, 100 grams, 62 yards, 50% wool / 50% acrylic, CYCA 6) comes in an array of gorgeous heather colors that define this super chunky wool blend for quick-knitting accessories and garments. We've already seen a few works in progress with this classic, instant gratification yarn, mainly for Tracey's Earhart's "Snowboarder Hats for Everyone" (Fiber Trends pattern AC91, \$5.95)...

Got milk? KOLLAGE YARNS "Dynamic Duo Reversible Fingerless Gloves" (\$5.50, #3348, shown lower right) is our "poster project" for the upcoming yarn tasting. Worked with just one hank of "1/2 N 1/2" yarn (\$17.95, 50 grams, 174 yards, 50% milk / 50% wool, CYCA 3), this is quickly becoming our fastest-selling new yarn. Come to our yarn tasting and receive a free KOLLAGE pattern with your purchase of "1/2 N 1/2". Another new KOLLAGE arrival is our favorite for fall: "Fantastic", which truly lives up to its name (\$8.95, 50 grams, 93 yards, 100% merino wool, CYCA yarn classification 4, Aran weight). Kathy is delighted that several of her designs will be published in upcoming special collections for KOLLAGE

YARNS -- stay tuned for updates on the availability of patterns...

# \*\*\* MORE GREAT NEW STUFF \*\*\*

KNIT ONE, CROCHET TOO's "Sideways Rainbows Jacket &Vest #1370" (\$4.50, shown at right) looks great in either version. Check out our model garment knit by Nancy Premoshis in beautiful NORO "Taiyo" (\$18.50, 100 grams, 220 yards, 40% cotton / 30% silk / 15% wool / 15% nylon, CYCA 4). Nancy will be teaching the vest class on August 22. A bevy of new patterns from K1, C2 have arrived (\$4.50 each), and most of these garments have extended plus sizing...

Think there is nothing new to learn about sock knitting? Not so -- everything old is new again! Coming later this month from LISA KNITS are knitter-friendly "Boomerang Socks" patterns (\$4.00 each) and we are the first to have 'em! Lisa Carnahan has designed cuff down and toe-up versions in two different gauges (fingering and DK). Lisa adapted a traditional, "old" German method for heel shaping, updating it for today's knitters. We will be offering classes by Lisa on this innovative technique, later this fall. New in our sock station are self-striping TREKKING "Hand Art" (\$20.50, 100 grams, 459 yards, 75% superwash wool / 25% polyamid, CYCA 2) and glorious marl striped "Maxima" (\$17.95, 100 grams, 459 yards, 75% wool / 25% nylon, CYCA 2)...

Looking for classic knits for all ages? BERROCO "Family Comfort #284" (\$8.95) features Aran, Fair Isle and circular sweaters in child's 2 to adult XL, plus baby layettes and accessories for fall. If you are looking for the perfect hat for any head or a great project for charity knitting, check out KALAMAZOO KNITS "Spiral Snuggler for the Family Pattern #4" (\$6.50) for worsted weight yarns...

Created from a luxurious mix of fibers, BERROCO "Seduce" (\$8.95, 40 grams, 100 yards; 47% rayon / 25% linen / 17% silk / 11% nylon, CYCA 4) was named for the immediate knitterly attraction that you will feel for this corded strand of color. You can make a light and easy, season-spanning garment in a breathable fabric that's practically weightless and cool to the touch...

We've been waiting since TNNA to bring you LOUET YARNS and they're here at last. We are pleased to introduce machine washable, sport weight "Euroflax" (\$23.95, 100 grams, 270 yards, 100% wet spun linen, CYCA 2). Pattern support (\$5.95 each) includes the lovely "Hysope" (shown lower left), an elegant, sophisticated openwork cardigan with your choice of two different sleeve lengths and the "Sasha Skirt", a fun, ruffled skirt with a knit-in waistband casing and underskirt where stitches are picked up to knit the contrasting ruffles...

For those who prefer circular needles to dpns for sock knitting, CLOVER introduces short 9" lengths and has extended its line to include US sizes 0, 1, and 2 in all lengths. Of course, we've got 'em in stock...



And, last but not least, Kathy's pick for most distinctive fall yarn, ROWAN YARNS "Lima", the most unique fiber we encountered at the TNNA market (\$12.95, 50 grams, 109 yards, 84% baby alpaca. 8% merino wool / 8% nylon, CYCA 4). This buttery soft worsted weight baby alpaca blend comes in a beautiful palette of heatherized colors. The construction of the yarn is basically a two-stitch I-cord which traps air, while keeping it lightweight and lofty, yet maintains its elasticity. Sample it out at our yarn tasting...

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# \*\*\* NOW ON OUR BOOKSHELF \*\*\*

INTERWEAVE PESS presents *Knitted Gifts* by Ann Budd (\$21.95, softcover) featuring irresistible projects to make and give. This book focuses on smaller projects that can be created in a relatively short period of time, which is perfect for those last-minute gifts. Projects range from easy-to-knit to more involved -- an ideal book for knitters of all skill levels. We are pleased that one of Kathy's designs is included in this classic

collection: The Curry & Spice Hat & Scarf (shown upper left). About this design, editor Ann Budd says, "For this hat and scarf set, Kathy Zimmerman used a quick and easy variation of the blackberry stitch in a soft and inviting self-striping yarn. The stitch pattern involves complimentary increases and decreases that result in a non-curling textured fabric that looks good on both sides -- just right for a simple scarf. The matching hat is worked back and forth in rows and seamed along the center back".

We've got so many favorites in this book, and customers have already vowed to work their way through it, making every project. Cute quickies include a coffee clutch cup sleeve for take-out coffee, texter's mitts with removable thumb flaps, a ruffled bottle sleeve to fancy up a gift of wine, his & hers socks, a felted yarn caddy, and a sugar & spice blanket. This book is a real keeper with some very clever ideas...

Twenty contemporary, stunningly beautiful projects from the book *Kristin Knits* (\$24.95, hard cover), written by Kristin Nicholas, will be showcased here from **Wednesday, August 5, 2009, through Wednesday, August 19, 2009.** Personally autographed bookplates will be available with the purchase of the book (quantities limited). All projects are worked with warm, vibrant shades of our lovely NASHUA HANDKNITS "Julia" yarn (\$7.95, 50 grams, 93 yards, 50% merino / 25% alpaca / 25% kid mohair, yarn classification 4). If you are confident with your knitting needles, but still feel a little unsure about improvising with color, take inspiration from these charming, imaginative handknit garments. # \*\*\* KNIT FOR THE CURE \*\*\*

As an event sponsor, Kathy and shopgal Marilee were invited to the Press Conference for the 2009 Westmoreland County Fair. During the luncheon, it was our pleasure to meet Michelle Brokenbek, a freelance feature writer for *Westmoreland Magazine*. We were discussing our annual Knit For The Cure Project, which began with our sponsorship of the County Fair scarf contest, and has grown into a collection of patterns, with profits from pattern sales benefitting a variety of causes. Michelle brought our attention to the disease that whispers, ovarian cancer. As a result, with the help of our designer friend Susan Shabo, Kathy's Kreations will add Susan's design, "The 'Not So Lacy' Lace Scarf" to our Collection, to raise awareness and promote education about ovarian cancer. Her scarf, made from a beautiful teal shade of MANOS "Silk-Blend", is currently on display in honor of Michelle Brokenbek (who incidentally is an ovarian cancer survivor), and has inspired us to plan a window in teal shades for Fort Ligonier Days...

## \*\*\* KNITTING TIPS AND TRICKS \*\*\*

Do you enjoy making hats for "Caps For Kids" or similar charity knitting / crocheting? If you use small balls of "stash" yarn for stripes or slip stitch patterns, decide the order in which you wish to place the colors, then "skewer" them onto a spare knitting needle to keep them in the order you want. Simply slip off the next color when ready and keep working away...

If you are working on a garter stitch project and have a problem keeping track of the right and wrong sides, use two different colors or types of knitting needles. Use one of each color / type. Color one is the right side and color two is the wrong side...

from Pauline Angione; KnitNet 7/15/09

When selecting a yarn for knitting lace, avoid firm, tightly spun yarn (like certain sock yarns). Choose mohair, silk, alpaca, or merino wool with a looser twist for a delicate appearance for openwork projects liks shawls and scarves... fom Shanta Moitra

If you are modifying a pattern, write down your changes. You may decide later to duplicate the same garment. If you do not write it down, you will not remember what you did.

For an easy bobble, work K1, P1, K1, P1, K1 into one stitch on the right side (public side) of your work, then purl these 5 stitches together on the wrong side of the work.

## \*\*\* STOCKINETTE FINGERLESS MITTENS \*\*\*

SIZE: Ladies' medium, one size fits all

MATERIALS: CLASSIC ELITE "Montera" 2 hanks (approx. 150 yards light bulky weight yarn, CYCA yarn classification 4), double-pointed knitting needles (dpns), US #8 & #9; tapestry needle for finishing

GAUGE: approx. 4 sts / 6 rows = 1" in stockinette stitch, with US size 9 needles DIRECTIONS: With smaller dpns, cast on 30 sts. Join, place marker (pm), being careful not to twist work. Work K1, P1 ribbing in rounds for 3". Change to larger dpns and knit 5 rounds.

Begin thumb gusset: K 14 sts, pm; inc 1 st in each of next 2 sts, pm, K remaining 14 sts. Knit 1 round.

Round 1: K to first marker, slip marker & increase in next st, knit to 1 st before 2nd marker, increase in next stitch, slip marker, K to end.

Round 2: Knit around without increasing.

Repeat rounds 1 & 2, inc 2 sts between markers every other round as established until there are 14 sts between markers, end with round 2.

Thumb: Working on 14 sts between markers ONLY, knit in rounds for 1". Work in K1, P1 rib for 2 rounds. Bind off all sts. Cut tail and sew thumb.

Hand: K across 14 sts, pick up 2 sts at base of thumb, knit to end. K all rounds on 30 sts until piece measures 4" or desired length above cuff. Work in rounds of K1, P1 for 2". Bind off all sts in rib pattern.

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## \*\*\* INQUIRING KNITTERS WANT TO KNOW \*\*\*

Jane B asks, "How can I get fringe to be the same length? I love fringe on a scarf, but can't get it to look even." Try cutting out a template made from a cardboard box or poster board, slightly more than half the measurement of the desired length of fringe (the knot in the fringe will use up a bit more of the length). Wrap yarn around this template many times, being careful not to pull too tightly and stretch it. Cut the yarn along the edge where you began winding. This should help you to make perfect fringe every time, Jane...

#### \*\*\* KNITTER'S DAY OUT 2009 \*\*\*

Knitter's Day Out is a one-day, one-evening event in the Harrisburg, PA area with the goal of promoting knitting. The 24th annual KDO 2009 will be held on Friday, September 25 and Saturday, September 26, 2009 at the Central Pennsylvania College. She will be teaching two three-hour classes -- one on slip-stitch colorplay and one on cables, featuring an original scarf design.
