*** GREAT NEW STUFF ***

Summer can be a busy time of year, but picking up a stitching project and taking a break to work even a few rows can restore a sense of calm and relaxation. Knitting and crocheting can be a remedy for elevating mood, like a serenity trip to your own private island. Enjoy the process, as well as the project. We've got endless possibilities for you to explore like these new arrivals to our shop scene...

Knitter's Magazine K123 Summer 2016 (\$6.95, cover shown upper left) focuses on the upcoming Olympics and "summer gold": "Shawls are popular knits. Whether they are simple and straightforward or complicated, they can be as captivating as any spectator sport, but without the stress of ever-changing scores and leads". With each of this issue's five options, you start with a few stitches and build to many. You can stop short for a smaller version or continue for a fuller size. There are garter stitch projects and rhythmic repeats of knits, purls, and yarn-overs, where you can chant a mantra to keep pace. Other interesting combinations include the new twin set (coupling skirts with matching tops), lacy tops, a lace & cable afghan and mitered shapes..

Whether for work or play, a lovely hand-knit top will beat a T-shirt any day. We are pleased that one of Kathy's designs is featured in this issue. The fabric in her *Diamond-T* design (shown lower right) "shines, thanks to the content of the yarn, but the trim silhouette and the picot hems and collar make this a class act". The description says: "The T-shirt is a summer mainstay -- ours takes it to a higher level with openwork diamond lace and picot hems. We present it as a casual top over a bright skirt, but imagine this tee styled for work with a more business-like profile".

In his editorial, Rick Mondragon tells us: "You don't need to be an Olympic-quality knitter to create the pieces from this issue -- you just need the courage to get started and proceed. Nothing beats the feeling of success!" We like that advice...

Create light, breezy and comfortable projects with CLASSIC ELITE YARNS "Sandpiper" (\$8.50, 50 grams, 114 yards, 100% cotton, CYCA #4). This unique cotton yarn has a marled look, with muted multicolored plies twisted together into a worsted weight. Each strand of "Sandpiper" has five space-dyed shades, giving it highlights and shadows that occur organically as the eight plies interact. These mingling colors add depth and interest, but their similar values means "Sandpiper" still shows texture and lace beautifully! Cotton is a fantastic choice for warmer weather wear, but savvy stitchers know that...

Summer is flying by and it will soon be time to come in from the garden, and return to Kathy's Kreations to beef up your knitting stash for crisp, cool days. *Knit Simple Fall 2016* (\$6.99) helps you plan with 30+ quick and easy knits that the family will love. For kids going back to school (or going for the first time), there are fun "Pre-K Rules" animal sweaters, delightful hats, fun bunny slippers and cute critter sweaters. Making the perfect shawl is easier than you think with the Shawls 101 feature. Bulky-knit home decor also makes a bold statement in this issue -- especially when you add a little texture...

New from MADDY LAINE is pattern ML187 "Pop On A Poncho" (\$6.50). This openwork lace rib topper, easy to knit in a cotton or luxury yarn, can take you from the beach to the ballroom. It is worked in one piece with a 2-row repeat pattern stitch, beginning at the lower front edge and finishing at the lower back edge with a neck opening slit. The poncho styling can be worn with the neck opening as a crew neck or a V-neck shape. Optional buttonholes can be worked on the side openings...



*** MORE GREAT NEW STUFF ***

PLYMOUTH YARNS adorable "Yarnimals" scarf kits will delight kids of all ages (\$24.50). Choose a bear, monkey, dog, cat or sheep. You knit the scarf portion, and then stitch the stuffed and pre-knit toy head and paws to one end, and the tail and back paws to the other. Voila! A warm, striped scarf with an adorable knit animal to keep you warm. The kit comes with a worsted weight 100 gram skein of self-striping, 100% acrylic yarn and pre-knit and stuffed head/paws/tail to stitch on when you're done, plus a pattern to tell you how it's done. Although the yarn itself is machine-washable acrylic, hand washing and drying flat is recommended due to the stuffing and stitch detail.

Crochet the cute Monkey or Owl (\$10.50, shown upper right) Hat from PLYMOUTH YARNS and you're sure to ne noticed! The pattern includes either knit or crochet directions from child to adult. When you purchase the yarn, 1 ball includes everything you need to make the hat -- the eyes, mouth, nose and tassels are already made -- just sew them on.

BERROCO Portfolio Volume 2 (\$18.50) is a collaboration between the Berroco Design Team and independent designers to create a stunning collection of innovative and timeless wardrobe pieces. We love the colorful "Teeter Totter Shawl", knit with our luxurious new arrival, "Ultra Alpaca Fine" (\$13.50, 100 grams, 433 yards, 50% wool / 30% super fine alpaca / 20% nylon, CYCA #1). This yarn is BERROCO's latest addition to the best-selling "Ultra Alpaca" family. It provides lovely drape and stitch definition for lightweight scarves and shawls. Machine washable and available in 17 popular melange heathers, the finer gauge "Ultra Alpaca Fine" is perfect for knitters who prefer lace weight yarns...

BERROCO's new fall yarn "Millefiori" (\$15.50, 100 grams, 186 yards, 50% wool / 50% acrylic, CYCA #4) has plenty of self-striping WOW factor. It sparks the imagination with bold, fun variegated colors that ebb and flow in random patterns to create a happy fabric. This yarn combines wool with acrylic for softness and stability with just a hint of shimmer. Pattern support includes booklet #377 (\$10.50) featuring lovely accessories and a waterfall cardigan. Variegated yarns are shown off best in simple patterns, and the six projects in this collection are a perfect match for this new blend in bold colors. "Kveta" (shown lower left) is knit from one narrow point to the full width and back down again. This simple garter stitch shawl uses dropped stitches to easily add fringe. Kathy has designed a special project for a fall magazine using this yarn -- more details later!

KNITTER'S PRIDE Knit Blockers (\$25.50 / box) are an efficient, effective, revolutionary tool for blocking your projects. Eliminate the need for scads of T-pins with these fork-like gadgets. Each box of rust-resistant, stainless steel pins comes with 12 blockers with 8 pins and 8 blockers with 4 pins. These are Kathy-tested, customer-tested and approved...

KNITTER'S PRIDE Needle Cases are a smart storage solution to keep all your knitting needles organized in one convenient case. Made from premium quality faux leather and intelligently designed, these zippered cases will keep all bag contents secure. Available in both fixed circular (\$30.50) and straight needle (\$22.50) options...



It's no secret that we love gadgets and organizers. New from LORNA'S LACES are small tins with four bent tip yarn needles for finishing (\$4.50, two each jumbo and sock weight). The large eye makes them easy to thread. *** SCOREBOARD KAL 2.0 ***

The second season of the Scoreboard KAL kicks off on August 1st! The first season proved to be amazing, especially with the Pittsburgh Steelers scoring their way into the playoffs (after all, our shop team name is "Stealing Stitches" and we sure did plenty of that!).

For those not familiar with this KAL -- the Scoreboard KAL allows fans to capture their favorite football team's season in the form of a hand-knit cowl with two options. The Point-by-Point version from last year represents every point scored by the home team and the opponent (requires 6 skeins HiKOO "Simplicity" in each of favorite team's colors and 1 skein to mark breaks between games). The new Play-by-Play cowl is a condensed version using half the amount of yarn (3 skeins each of HiKOO "Simplicity" in two colors plus optional break color). Both versions require US size 6 or 7 16" circular knitting needles. We have plenty of black and gold inventory, plus yarn for Pitt, WVU, Penn State & other AFC North teams...

*** AUGUST KNIT ALONG ***

If you would like to try out an easy project using gradients (think tonal variegation), TRENDSETTER YARNS "Transitions Boxed Rib T Scarf" is our featured July knit along project. Knit with US size 5 needles, this beginner-easy side-to-side triangular shawl is worked in an easy combination of stockinette stitch and garter. Join us every Friday in August from 10 am - 2 pm to "knit along". This one skein of yarn in its own carrying case does all the color work for you -- all you have to do is knit and purl (doesn't get much easier!)...

*** IT'S ALL ABOUT GAUGE ***

Gauge is the key to successful knitting. The knitting term "gauge" refers to how tightly or loosely the knitted fabric is worked. Gauge is the number of stitches in a horizontal inch of knitted fabric and the number of rows in a vertical inch of knitted fabric. It is determined by calculating the number of stitches (horizontal) and rows (vertical) per inch or centimeter by a specific knitter with a specific yarn, specific needles and a specific pattern stitch (YARN - STITCH PATTERN - NEEDLES - HANDS). Changing any one of these variables results in a difference in gauge. Each new configuration requires a separate swatch and a separate gauge measurement.

Elements that contribute to the look and feel of the fabric you will make include:

- Color & texture of both yarn and the resulting fabric
- The size and type of yarn
- The use of stitches and patterns
- The draping or insulating properties of the fibers you choose
- The quality of the fibers you choose
- The composition and shape of your needles
- Your individual knitting "touch", as unique as your fingerprints

You're in charge! Begin with the needle size recommended by the manufacturer on the ball band, then try one size larger or smaller to decide what type of fabric looks best. If your swatch is smaller that the stated gauge, try larger needles. If it is larger, try smaller needles. Keep blocking and swatching until your blocked gauge is on target and you have a fabric that you like. As a general rule, a fine yarn will have more stitches and rows per inch than a bulky yarn. Cast on enough stitches to accommodate an even number of stitch pattern repeats. A minimum of two repeats, both horizontally and vertically, is needed. Calculate stitches and rows over the entire swatch. Do not underestimate the importance of decimals!

Handle the swatch just as you will handle the finished garment every time you clean it. Before calculating gauge, block or launder the swatch to obtain an accurate measurement. The warmth and moisture of cleaning relaxes the fibers, so the swatch will lie flat and the stitches become fully displayed. The overall dimensions may change as the surface becomes smoother. With the swatch laid flat, pin two points at 4" in the center of the swatch on the same row. Traditional gauge rulers measure 2", but a MINIMUM 6" X 6" swatch is recommended for best results.

Gauge will most likely change when you move from knitting flat (rows) to circular knitting (rounds). Your gauge may change from your swatch to the knitted piece, so check your knitting every few inches to make sure it is still accurate. Take it off the working needle, onto a blocking wire or waste yarn, and lay it flat to measure.

Some knitters believe row gauge is not as important as stitch gauge. Think again -- this is not necessarily true, expecially when shaping pieces (such as sleeves) or when working a specific chart (intarsia). If you do not have the correct row gauge, your piece may be too long or too short. Some sweaters or shawls are worked from side to side. In this case, the rows determine the width, making the row gauge essential for proper fit.

What happens if your stitch gauge is perfect, but your row gauge is not? Or vice versa? Refer to the schematic(a line drawing showing the measurements & shape of the finished piece) and do some math to make modifications. As a general rule, stitch gauge is more dependent on the size of the needle and row gauge is affected more by the fiber choice.

Golden Rules from Maggie Rhighetti, author of Knitting In Plain English:

- You never know what a yarn will do until you make a swatch
- The simpler a yarn is, the more complicated a pattern stitch can be used. The more complicated the yarn, the simpler the stitch pattern should be.

What do you do with all those half skeins of yarn left over from other projects? Mixed media is all the rage.
