*** GREAT NEW STUFF ***

The weather outside may be frightful, but keeping warm with our favorite past time is so delightful! It's the year of you and improved -- prepare for re-launch with these goodies...

OK, we've got a lot of winter to go, but now is the time to start working on projects to be done in time to wear transitional knits. Knitscene Spring 2018 (\$7.99, shown upper left) has arrived, with clean, modern, everyday wearable eclectic knits and reliable spring pieces. This is the "Throwback Issue", filled with slammin' 90s knits. The Nostalgic Knit Story revives and re-thinks fashion trends of the late 1980s and early 1990s, looking to pop culture for inspiration. Or, as the editors say: "The 90s called! They want their knits back!" These designs bring back to life bright, fun knits that propels them into today. In the Spring Layers Story, you'll find fiber blends for warmer weather (it *will* happen again and you want to be prepared), light and airy pieces in traditionally feminine colorways, and beautiful lace patterns. "Because spring is a transitional season, it is always nice to have some options for layering that are light enough to carry with you during the day and warm enough to wear after the sun dips below the horizon and the chill sets in". In this issue's technical article, there is fantastic information with excellent illustrations for substituting the magic German short-rows for wrap-and-turn short-rows that makes this particular issue a keeper. It's time to refresh your wardrobe with 16 knits for spring...

Taking its name from the Norwegian word for happiness, LYKKE INTERCHANGEABLE CIRCULAR NEEDLES standard sets are now available in weathered styling indigo (denim blue) and umber (light golden brown) sets (\$125.50). LYKKE uses high quality materials and thoughtful design to produce great-looking, durable, hard-working and impeccably detailed products. These needles are made of smooth, polished hard birch with a beautiful glossy finish that varies with the wood grain. The wood quickly adjusts to your body temperature, so yarn slides smoothly, without much friction or sticking. The tapered tips are long and slender for precise stitchwork, with the needle sizes etched into the black metal endcap. There is a smooth join to the cables, which are very flexible. The standard set includes 5" tips in 12 sizes US 4 - US 17, and comes in a matching denim-look fold-up case with elastic that's perfectly matched to the size of each needle pair. The large storage pocket contains 5 cords (two 24", two 32", one 40"), 4 keys, 2 cord connectors and 4 stoppers. Spare cords are also sold separately. New 24" fixed circulars in gray have also arrived...

ROWAN "Cashmere Tweed" (\$14.50, 25 grams, 96 yards, 80% virgin wool/20% cashmere, CYCA #3) is made of a premium wool and cashmere blend, making it extra special and absolutely stylish. The classic color palette and versatile DK weight make it the perfect choice for classic winter sweaters and accessories (we love it for CHURCHMOUSE CLASSICS Welted Fingerless Mitts and Cowl). It creates an incredibly soft fabric, unlike any other...

The new DREAM IN COLOR green color palette is here! It is a well-known fact that green is the favorite color of Veronica Van, the dye-master genius behind DREAM IN COLOR. These glowing, living, shining greens inspire, and fill us with joy! These shades jump out at you and command attention. They shimmer and dance with the essence of the natural world around us. Our latest arrivals are shown at lower right in "Jilly" (\$22.50, 113 grams, 440 yards, 100% superwash merino wool, CYCA #2). Designed with shawls and accessories in mind, several of our customers are choosing shades from this palette (and the previously-introduced teal and blue palettes) for shawl projects like "Find Your Fade" and "The Girl From the Grocery Store". We're in love with these colors, and are sure that you will be, too...



*** MORE GREAT NEW STUFF ***

With winter's wicked post-holidays blast of frigid weather, we look forward to cozying up in our favorite chair to indulge in some constructive stitching time. It's the perfect time to learn a new knitting technique. Let's tackle the Fair Isle trend! This month's DREAM IN COLOR "Dream Club" is one of everyone's favorite yarns (and our best-selling yarn of 2017), "Jilly With Cashmere"! The great thing about this month's kit is that it is two skeins of contrasting "Jilly With Cashmere" (speckled gray & berry Chesley and solid black plum) that will look great in any shawl or hat pattern. This month's suggested project, and our January 2018 knit along, is a super cute Fair Isle hat and mittens set designed by Rachel Coopey (shown upper right). These accessories "combine geometric colorwork and a stylish cable rib detail with stunning results". Add some colorwork skills to your knitting repertoire this winter!

Simply insert your circular knitting needle tips into this "magic wand" -- the silicone end will protect your needles, joins and stitches. This device is safe to shove into your knitting bag and move on. Incredibly strong yet lightweight, it holds up to two US size 9 needles. We are among the first yarn shops to introduce the new teal color, just in ...

Our best-selling patterns of 2017 were from CHURCHMOUSE CLASSICS, everything from their "First Projects" knit and crochet collections to a variety of ponchos and accessories. A new arrival for us is the "English Mesh Lace Scarf" (\$6.50), featuring a simple but lovely stitch. A four + four-row repeat and easy-to-see centered stitch alignments make this the perfect pattern for learning to "read" your knitting. It's a relaxing and satisfying knit for accomplished lace knitters, too. You might like to know that this scarf pairs beautifully with the Beaded English Mesh Lace gloves from the "Lace-Back Fingerless Mitts" pattern (\$8.50). A pleasant knit, they make great gifts for feminine and sporty friends alike. These patterns are also both ideal for learning to read stitch charts. A little beading gilds the lily, another new technique to learn. Have you seen our new MIYUKI 6.0 bead selection? They look great on a variety of accessories and especially "enchanted evening" shawls...

New from DELICIOUS YARNS is the "Two-sided Lacy Cowl" (\$64.00 kit, includes pattern and two skeins of yarn), the perfect accessory for any occasion. Splashes of color shine through the lace pattern creating an unusual effect. This simple knit creates such a unique and stylish color, while the clever construction is so much fun to knit. The kit comes in a cute bakery-style box that makes it perfect for gift giving, or to make as a gift...

Grab your needles and hooks and dig into the exclusive new flavors of DELICIOUS YARNS Fresh Baked Yarn Club Winter 2018 (\$99.95, includes three yarns and kit backpack bag). This scrumptious stuff is made up on the coolest new yarn base -- Superwash Merino & Bamboo! You will want to cozy up to "Glazed" in Boysenberry Frosting, as well as brand new "Vanilla Speckles Plus" styling in Snowcone (blue & purple specks) and Popsicle (pink & purple specks). The two suggested patterns for this trio are "Heartland Brioché Cowl" by Linda Stellick (\$6.50 Ravelry Pro download, shown lower left with yarns) and "Echo Cowl" (\$6.00, Ravelry Pro download, shown upper left page 8). *** LITTLE HATS, BIG HEARTS ***

Kathy's Kreations is joining volunteers from around the country and the American Heart Association, in connection with the Children's Heart Foundation, to celebrate American

Heart Month by knitting and crocheting tiny red hats for babies born in February 2018 at participating hospitals. "Little Hats, Big Hearts" honors babies, moms and heart healthy lives in a very special way. Supporters are knitting and crocheting red hats to be given out to thousands of babies during American Heart Month in order to empower moms to live heart healthy lives and to help their children do the same. Together, we are working to raise awareness, provide resources and inspire moms to take their family's heart health to heart while also raising awareness about congenital heart defects.

If you would like to participate, Kathy's Kreations will be collecting hats from now through January 10, 2018. You may use a knit or crochet pattern of your choice. The only specifications are that the hats be made of acrylic or cotton yarn, in a medium to heavy weight, and be machine washable and dryable. Hats will be donated to the Excelsior Westmoreland Hospital Women's Auxiliary, who will send them to the American Heart Association for cleaning, tagging and distribution...

*** KAREN'S RED MOCK CABLE BABY HAT ***

Our thanks to Karen McCullough for sharing her original design hat to raise awareness for congenital heart disease and patients with heart valve problems...

SIZE: to fit newborn 12" head circumference

MATERIALS: US Size 4 & US size 6 knitting needles; approx. 100 yards worsted yarn (Berroco "Comfort" suggested); tapestry needle

GAUGE: 5 sts = 1"

ABBREVIATIONS: K - knit; K2tog - Knit 2 together; P - purl; P2tog - Purl 2 together; pssso - pass the slipped stitch over

MOCK CABLE PATTERN (as seen in Michelle Hunter's *Building Blocks* book)

Row 1 (right side): P2; *k3, p2; repeat from * across row.

Row 2: K2; *p3, k2; repeat from * across row.

Row 3: P1; *slip 1 as if to purl, k2, pssso, p2; repeat from * across row.

Row 4: K1; *p1, yo, p1, k2; repeat from * across row.

Repeat rows 1 - 4 for pattern stitch.

INSTRUCTIONS (worked flat and seamed):

With smaller needles and using long-tail cast-on, cast on 62 stitches -- do not join.

Row 1: K1, *K1, P1; repeat from * across row to last stitch, K1.

Rows 2-7: Repeat Row 1.

Rows 8-11: Change to larger needles and keeping the first and last stitches as K1, work Mock Cable Pattern Starting with row 1.

Repeat rows 8-11 four times.

Decrease rows:

Row 1: K1, *K10, K2tog; repeat from * across row to last stitch, K1.

Row 2: K1, *P 9, P2tog; repeat from * across to last stitch, K1

Repeat Rows 1 & 2 working one less stitch between decreases on every row until 6 stitches remain. Cut yarn leaving 10 inches, thread tapestry needle and pull through the remaining 6 stitches. Fasten tightly. Sew seams using mattress stitch. Weave in ends.

*** SPRING BUDS HAND TOWEL ***

This handy and useful kitchen accessory was designed by Mary Anne Showers, who graciously shared her pattern with us. Thank you, Mary Anne!

MATERIALS: 100% cotton worsted weight yarn, 2½ - 3 oz.; US Size 7 knitting need ¾" button

ABBREVIATIONS:

Kfb: Knit front and back in same stitch.

KLP (knit, lift & pass): K3, lift first st & pass it over sts 2 & 3.

INSTRUCTIONS:

Cast on 43 sts.

Knit 4 rows. NOTE: Slip 1st st after row 1.

Row 5 (RS): Sl 1, k3 (edge sts), k3, kfb, (k8, kfb) 3 times, k4, (edge sts) k4. (47 sts)

Row 6 (WS): Sl 1, k3, p39, k4.

Row 7: Sl 1, knit across.

Row 8: Sl 1, k3, p39, k4.

Row 9: Sl 1, k3, k2, *KLP, k5; repeat from *, end last rep k2, (edge) k4. (42 sts)

Row 10: Sl 1, k3, p1, *k1, [p1, yo, p1] in next 2 sts, k1, p3; rep from *, end last rep p1, (edge) k4. (47 sts)

Rows 11-14: repeat rows 7 & 8 twice.

Row 15: Sl 1, k3, k6, *KLP, k5; repeat from *, end last rep k6, (edge) k4. (43 sts)

Row 16: Sl 1, k3, p5, *k1, [p1, yo, p1] in next 2 sts, k1, p3; repeat from *, end last rep p5, (edge) k4. (47 sts)

Rows 17-20: repeat rows 7 & 8 twice.

Repeat rows 9-20 until towel measures 12" from cast-on, ending with a WS row.

TOP:

Row 1: Knit 2 tog 12 times, k1, k2 tog 11 times. (24 sts)

Row 2: [K1, p1] 3 times, k2 tog, [p1, k1] 3 times, p1, k2 tog, [p1, k1] 3 times, p1. (22 sts)

Rows 3 & 5: P1, k1 across.

Row 4: K1, p1 across.

Row 6: K2 tog, *p2 tog, k2 tog; rep from * across. (11 sts)

Row 7: K1, *p1, k1; repeat from * across.

Repeat row 7 until narrow part of top measures 3", ending with a WS row.

SHAPING & BUTTONHOLE:

Row 1: K2 tog, p2 tog, k1, yo, k2 tog, p2 tog, k2 tog. (7 sts)

Row 2: K1, *p1, k1; repeat from * across.

Rows 3 & 4: repeat row 2.

Row 5: k2 tog, k1, p1, k1, p2 tog.

Bind off.

Sew button to center of the bottom of wide seed st area.

*** INQUIRING KNITTERS WANT TO KNOW ***

Linda C asks: "Do I start working a stitch pattern chart with the numbers on the right side of the graph?"

Kathy answers: "Stitch charts give a visual impression of how the finished pattern will appear, enabling long, complicated directions to be represented clearly and concisely. Each square represents a stitch and each horizontal line a row. Row numbers are shown at the sides of the chart and represent the BEGINNING of the row. Charts are worked from bottom to top, exactly the way the knitting is formed, and the sequence of the rows is repeated. Symbols are used for each knitting action and appear as they will be on the PUBLIC side of the work. Since symbols are not standardized, ALWAYS refer to the written explanation of the technique, also known as a key or legend.

When knitting flat (back and forth), right-side (RS) rows are always read RIGHT TO LEFT. Wrong-side (WS) rows are always read LEFT TO RIGHT. Please be aware that in a flat knitting chart, the symbols have two meanings -- one for the right side of the work, and another for working the wrong side. When working in the round (circularly), the numbers always are on the right side of the chart and the knitting is worked RIGHT TO LEFT for all rounds. It is a good idea to always review the chart before you begin knitting to become familiar with the symbol meanings...

Our Building Blocks class series with instructor Karen McCullough continues on **Tuesday, February 6, 2018, 10:00 am - 2:00 pm**. It's not too late to join in on the group. Each month, Karen introduces you to a new skill with a new block from Michelle Hunter's *Building Blocks* book. This month's pattern stitch is mock cable, which inspired Karen to design a tiny red hat for our *Little Hats, Big Hearts* project (see page 4)...


Did you make a New Year's resolution to learn how to crochet? We've got a great "First Project" class for you! Karen Voshall will teach "Crocheted Hand Warmers" on **Saturday, January 27, 2018, from 12 noon to 2 pm**. This class is intended for newer crocheters wanting to get a solid understanding of the basics. The basic mitts pattern is worked in one simple little stitch --single crochet -- and students will learn how to turn a row and keep edges straight as well as finishing. Registration fee is \$20 per class plus student supplies: 150 yards worsted weight yarn (Karen recommends HiKOO "Simplinatural"), crochet hook H/8 (5.0 mm), and purchase of CHURCHMOUSE CLASSICS "Crocheted Handwarmers: 1 Stitch 3 Ways" pattern (\$8.50, shown upper right includes three fingerless mitts projects in one, all using single crochet). Please call 724-238-9320 to reserve your place.

Fingerless mitts are very popular -- what a wonderful accessory to keep your hands warm when working on the computer or texting! Learn to knit cables, working in the round with two circulars at a time and fingerless mitts all in the same class! Marian Lech will be teaching "Fingerless Mitts, With or Without a Cable" on **Saturday, February 3, 2018, from 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm**. Registration fee is \$20 per class plus student supplies: 100 yards worsted or lightweight chunky yarn; two circular knitting needles US size 9 in 16" length; US 9 double-pointed needles; pattern will be provided. *** LACE CLASS SERIES ***

If you love lace, Michelle Hunter's latest installment in her book series, *Building With Lace* (\$20.50), is the perfect next project for you, designed to take the casual knitter to an experienced level. In this book, named one of the top 10 knitting books published in 2017, Michelle has designed a beautiful sampler shawl with nine carefully chosen lace stitch patterns and a beaded border. These lace patterns illustrate essential lace skills such as the provisional cast on, reading charts, increases, decreases, lifelines, afterthought yarn overs, Japanese lace, Russian join, cabling without a cable needle, smocking stitches, Estonian nupps, applied borders, and adding beads. Join our instructor Kathy Erhard as she demonstrates these skills and work along to make your own gorgeous lace shawl as a wearable showcase of your skills. Classes begin **January 20, 2018 from 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm** at Kathy's Kreations, beginning with lace basics (swatch shown lower left) and will be held the third Saturday of each month from **January through October**. The mastery of each skill builds one upon another in subsequent patterns.

Michelle recommends SKACEL HiKOO "Rylie", a gorgeous blend of baby alpaca, mulberry silk, and linen for this shawl. The baby alpaca's inviting softness with mulberry silk's attractive luster and drape combines with linen's distinctive stitch definition to make your shawl stunning. Please choose Michelle's book and your favorite color of HiKOO "Rylie" from Kathy's Kreations (or one of her other select yarns) for this class and bring size US 6 24" circular needles. We now have a large selection of Miyuki glass beads for the border accent (two packs of beads needed for project). Together, we can take your knitting to a whole new level.
