*** GREAT NEW STUFF ***

Fresh finds have arrived -- let's give them a warm welcome! Spring has sprung in a big way here in the Laurel Highlands. A spirit of renewal and rejuvenation has us looking to the fashion world for some trend-based inspiration. It's a good time to learn something new, to plan projects for the upcoming season, and to update gadgets and tools. Keep in mind that the best summer wardrobes start with an indispensable accessory. Here are some ideas that we hope you'll find irresistible...

Single ply "Milo" from MANOS DEL URUGUAY (\$28.50, 100 grams, 380 yards, 65% merino wool / 35% linen, CYCA #3) is a gorgeous blend of wool and linen in a DK weight. "Milo" offers a unique, elegant-but-rustic quality on the finished fabric, and also provides excellent drape. This is a perfect choice for CHURCHMOUSE CLASSICS *Boxy Lace Tee* or *Sideways Tee*, and looks great in a sophisticated neutral or a fun, on-trend shade...

OK, we mentioned it, so let us tell you about CHURCHMOUSE CLASSICS new Spring/Summer 2019 knit collection. We are so excited to be one of the yarn shops to help launch these three garment and two accessory designs on Thursday, May 2! Lacy and sweet, simple and sleek, these five new patterns are seasonless, so fun to knit, and worthy of a modern wardrobe:

- Sideways Tee (\$12.50, DK weight, shown upper left): A clever design with a deceptively simple, classic result, this tee is equally comfortable worn alone in a cool plant fiber or as a popover in a woollier yarn. The tapered shape allows for plenty of ease at the bust, while providing a relaxed and flattering bottom edge at hip length. The sideways approach lends a modern pivot to a familiar style...
- Demi Lune Scarf (\$6.50, lace weight, shown lower right): The relaxing rhythm of stockinette stitch creates a simple, supple fabric -- the perfect canvas to play with degrees of sheerness. Adding a feminine eyelet lace edge keeps the knitting interesting. With long tapered ends, this scarf's shape lies somewhere between half moon and triangle. Started at the long top edge, the knitting gets faster and faster as you go. We suggest BERROCO YARNS "Ultra Wool Fine" for this project...
- Pretty Perfect Square (\$8.50, lace weight, shown page 6 upper left): This simple, lightweight knit square mimics the shape and scale of a classic silk scarf. I-cord edgings and bind-off details create the look of a hand-rolled hem. This pattern is more of a "recipe" really, with details given for three variations (color block with pinstripe, 4-color uneven stripes, and 2-color 3-row stripes). There are tips on how to create your own to make a square of any size with any color sequence and your choice of wide stripes, narrow stripes, random stripes, even stripes, hand-painted stripes, or maybe an all-over solid or tonal -- we invite you to just play!
- Boxy Lace Tee (\$12.50, DK weight, shown page 7 upper right): This is CHURCHMOUSE's first lace garment! We like the juxtaposition of a modern boxy shape and feminine lace motifs knit on a slightly grand scale. With shaped shoulders, a gently dipping neckline, finessed fit and finish, and options for two different lengths, this lacy top is easy to pop on, and feels both comfy and really pretty. The 8-page pattern includes special techniques such as swatching for gauge in lace patterns and "clip & turn" short-row shaping...
- Wrap & Tie Apron Vest (\$12.50, sport weight, shown page 8 upper left): We love the versatility of this piece. Wrap and tie it across the front for the charm of a worker's apron or kitchen coverall. Or, wear it open for an elegant, elongated drape. Or, lower the tie placement for more asymmetry. It's the perfect balance of beauty and utility...



*** MORE GREAT NEW STUFF ***

New hard-copy patterns for knit and crochet have arrived from DEEP SOUTH FIBERS and some of your favorite designers, with projects perfect for warm weather out-on-the-porch stitching. These patterns come with a Ravelry download code so that you can also add them to your electronic library.

- *Veronika* by COCO KNITS (\$8.50, knit) -- This "swoncho" is light and swingy, not at all fitted, yet with snug cuffs that make it easier to wear than a poncho. It's easy to throw on over almost any outfit, so you'll find yourself reaching for it again and again. The front and back curves are created using short rows, using the YO method of short row shaping. After the curves, everything is joined, and the pattern is seamless and circular all the way up...
- *Lopsy Rabbit* by LOOP (\$8.95, crochet) -- We have received many requests for crocheted animals and we think this whimsical floppy-eared bunny is the cutest! A charming little scarf is the perfect accessory for Lopsy...
- *The Weekender* by DREA RENEE KNITS (\$8.50, knit, shown upper right) -- This drop shoulder sweater promises to be your most favorite addition to your wardrobe! Designer Andrea Mowry combined her favorite attributes of texture, faux seams, drop shoulder, and some positive ease to create this versatile, flattering sweater. No matter your body type, it is perfect for wearing to the office or out on weekend hike in the woods. Leave off the sleeves so you can wear it in warmer weather or layered over a long sleeve tee!
- *Wildwood* by DREA RENEE KNITS (\$7.50, booklet, knit) -- This 3-color shawl is full of relaxing garter stitch with a mix of engaging short row stripes and feather & fan lace. Worked with fingering weight yarn...
- *Nightshift* by DREA RENEE KNITS (\$10.50, knit) -- This super fun worsted weight shawl has a large canvas for colorplay. Akin to its famous DK weight cousin, *The Shift Cowl*, this pattern comes with a "recipe" to make it all your own, or row by row for those who want to play it safe! This sideways shawl is worked with six color shades in slipped stitches and mosaic knitting and features an I-cord edging...
- *Santana* by IMAGINE KNIT DESIGNS (\$6.50, crochet) -- Reminiscent of the 70's, this simple crochet pattern is a creative update on the poncho. Choose an interesting color story or textures with different yarns, or incorporate odds & ends from your stash. Use a variety of colors and weights from fingering to worsted weight. Sleeves are created with simple seaming...
- *Pixel* by KRAFTLING (\$6.50, crochet) -- This is a great stash-busting blanket for crocheters! This cheery, dense throw makes a great accent in any room. It features a background main color plus odds and ends of accent colors woven throughout...
- *Ocean Throw* by KAREN WHOOLEY (\$7.50, crochet) -- This afghan reminds us of a clear, sunny day on the beach. The stitch pattern is a very simple zig-zag stitch that gives the impressions of waves, and the colors are gorgeous blues and greys of the water. With just a 4-row repeat for this project, you can adjust the length and width to suit your needs (all details in the pattern notes). And to customize it even further, pick 3 of your favorite colors to match any room in your house...
- *California* by KRAFTLING (\$6.50, crochet, shown lower left) -- This crocheted blanket reminds us of the 1980's California. It's all about vintage colors with a landscape inspiration: sunshine, sea, sand, sunsets, and trees. Worked mainly in double crochet stitches, this blanket is pretty straightforward and quick to make with worsted weight yarn. You should also be familiar with working around the posts (or willing to learn). *California* is built with motifs that are then worked together to create this throw. You could easily size up or down to increase or decrease the size depending on its purpose. The blanket measures 50" X 58" = perfect beach blanket size!

*** MAY 2019 KNIT ALONG ***

Magical Thinking was designed by Casapinka for the 2019 LYS Day, now available as a Ravelry Pro download (\$7.00). It features DREAM IN COLOR "Smoochy with Cashmere" in three complimentary tonals. *Magical Thinking* is made in the round from the top down. CASAPINKA says: "Like *All Points South*, but slightly shorter with the point meant to be worn to the side. It is made to fit all sizes and shapes; if you are of larger bust, it will ruche up over your chest as a large, drapery cowl and it will fall lower on your shoulders if you are smaller in the bust. Three colors interact together but **A and C interact more often with each other** and B is the contrast color that is more often on its own and is used in the border."

Join us for fun knitting every Friday during May 2019 at Kathy's Kreations from 10:00 am - 2:00 pm for the group project, the continuation of previous KALs, or any other works in progress purchased here. *** UPCOMING KNITTING CLASSES (call 724-238-9320 to register for all classes) ***

Colorwork can seem like a challenging task, but, luckily, instructor Karen McCullough will introduce you to a wonderful new knitting technique each month with panels from Michelle Hunter's *Building In Color* book. Don't worry about jumping in late -- it is never too late for the color series. Join Karen on **Tuesday, May 7, 2019, 10:00 am - 12 noon** to learn *Intarsia Cable*. While intarsia is generally worked in stockinette stitch, deviating from this norm brings a level of sophistication to the technique. In this month's panel, a center braided cable is nestled between contrasting colors worked in reverse stockinette stitch for dramatic impact. Work the panel from either text or chart form. These are fabulous skills to add to your bag of color knitting tricks. Registration fee is \$10 per class plus materials.

Knitting, and knitted lace in particular, has its own language. To understand it, it helps to have an expert to guide you through the terminology and technical how-to's. In the *Building With Lace* series, join our instructor Kathy Erhard as she demonstrates lace skills and work along to make your own gorgeous sampler shawl as a wearable showcase of your skills. Our next class is scheduled for **May 18, 2019 from 9:00 am - 12 noon** at Kathy's Kreations and will be held on a Saturday morning of each month from **May through November**. It's not too late to join the group and take your lace skills from casual to experienced as the series continues!

This month, the lace patterns in Michelle Hunter's *Building With Lace* shawl just keep getting prettier as cabled texture is added to the delicate lace. Cables make everything more attractive and lace patterns are no exception. Don't let working cables slow your knitting down by fiddling with a cable needle. Learn how to make left- and right-crossed cables without a cable needle and discover how to make Michelle's shawl along with your other cabled projects fly off the needles. Students are using the gorgeous HiKOO by Skacel "Rylie" (50% baby alpaca/25% mulberry silk/25% linen) yarn, so see Kathy Z for this yarn or a suitable substitute and bring a size 5 (3.75 mm) 24" circular needle. Knitters can cable with confidence with "Rylie" as stitches stay in place if accidentally dropped off the needle. Fee is \$20 per class. Call 724-238-9320 to register.

Spirals of cascading traveling stitches and a contrasting cuff, toe, and afterthought heel give **Falling Dominoes Socks** their eye-catching appeal. Join instructor Kathy Erhard on **Saturday, May 18, 2019 from 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm** at Kathy's Kreations to learn how to make these fun socks (shown upper right). ---continued on next page---

Class supplies include 550 - 900 yards of a lace, fingering or sport yarn from Kathy's Kreations and a crochet hook one or two sizes larger than the yarn label suggests. Pattern will be provided with both text and a chart diagram. Our shop sample is made with HiKOO "Zauber Flower", with 656 yards and a full color repeat in just one beautiful gradient cake. *** KATHY'S SPRING BREAK SALAD ***

This is Kathy's version of a Mandarin Salad recipe, inspired by the Roof Garden Knitting Guild's summer picnic collection, originally submitted by Janice Reeping. Kathy's recipe is for a crowd, but can be halved for a smaller amount.

- 2 cups sliced almonds
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 large jar (24 oz.) mandarin oranges, well drained (reserve 2 tbsp. liquid)
- 1 box each Market District Icicle lettuce, Buckeye Blend lettuce & Baby Spring mix, rinsed and drained
- 1 cup celery, diced
- 1 bunch green onions, sliced
- 1/2 bottle Brianna's Home Style Blush Wine vinaigrette dressing

DIRECTIONS

- Over medium heat, heat almonds, sugar and 2 tbsp. liquid from oranges (keep stirring well to avoid burning) until sugar dissolved and almonds well-coated. Remove from heat and set aside to cool. Just before serving, toss together lettuces, celery and onions in large salad bowl. Top with drained oranges and almond mixture. Add dressing, toss well and enjoy the compliments!

*** NEW AND TRENDY ***

In the official blog of the National Needlework Association, Yarn Group Chair Heather Zoppetti shared some Spring 2019 NeedleArts Trends. We think she is "spot on", so we are sharing her thoughts with you:

"CROCHET -- Crochet is BIG. If you haven't learned to crochet yet, now is a great time. If you already know how, this spring is the perfect time to teach someone else! Crochet sweaters and accessories are ideal for spring and summer because crochet can do lace like nobody's business. Gone are the days of crochet being just 'granny squares' and toilet paper covers. There is an abundance of beautiful and fashionable patterns. If you haven't checked out crochet patterns in a while, I recommend giving them another look...you will be surprised!" [Kathy adds: Mary Pickar will be teaching a class on our stunning crochet Virus Shawl, now prominently displayed on our new mannequins in our big window]

Heather continues: "COLOR BLOCKING -- Blocks of color, whether two or more, are everywhere. Shirts, dresses and even accessories are getting the color-block treatment. Bold blocks of color are fun and easy to incorporate into a bright, spring wardrobe. If you're knitting, crocheting, or weaving, color-blocking is a great way to add visual interest to your garments or to use multiple hues of yarn."

[Kathy adds: A perfect example of color-blocking is illustrated in the colorful shawl accessory from CHURCHMOUSE CLASSICS *Pretty Perfect Square*, shown upper left. This design features a blend of sophisticated neutrals, and a few on-trend brights -- show your colors!]

"NEON -- Pops of color, especially neons against neutrals, make for a bold, trendy statement. While neutrals are always popular, this season is seeing creators add just a hint of something bright amid a neutral backdrop for added excitement. Consider incorporating neon stripes into a project or just a touch of neon in a border. Another idea? Introduce a bright neon accessory to an otherwise neutral outfit.

CREATIVE SLEEVES -- Fun sleeve shapes are everywhere! Whether bell, puff or bow-adorned sleeves, the creative shapes emerging are sure to make your design on-trend. While bell sleeves are mostly of the long variety, puff sleeves can be either long or short. The same goes for sleeves adorned with bows. [*Note: While I included bows here with sleeves, the bow trend can really be seen everywhere -- from sleeves to cuffs, waistbands and even necklines!*]"

*** BOLD PRINTED YARNS ARE TRENDING AT KATHY'S KREATIONS ***

Get on trend with our monthly limited edition yarn selection from BAAH YARNS "La Jolla" (\$32.50, 115 grams, 400 yards, 100% superwash merino, CYCA #2). *May '19* creates a soft, colorful, lustrous fabric with a subtle drape...

If you enjoyed working with HIKOO "Concentric" baby alpaca, you'll love "Concentric Cotton" (\$36.50, 200 grams, 929 yards, 100% Pima Cotton, CYCA #2). This yarn, made of gloriously soft Pima cotton dyed in stunning color gradients, knits at heavy fingering to sport weight gauge. "Concentric Cotton" is made from four non-ply strands and is great for drapery shawls, lightweight tops, and more (check out our new CHURCHMOUSE CLASSICS patterns)! This yarn has whopping yardage, allowing you plenty of project choices with just one skein...

*** KNITTING TIPS AND TRICKS ***

From Gaile Morrison, our Spring Break instructor: When making a baby sweater as a gift, place the sweater on a 12 - 18" stuffed animal as part of the gift (Gaile prefers a teddy bear). When the baby outgrows the sweater, Mom can display it on the bear as a keepsake. Thanks, Gaile!

From Kathy Erhard: When working slip stitch or patterns, do not use "homemade" yarn rings or soft stitch markers as they may unintentionally slide out of place. Metal rings or removable locking stitch markers stay in place more securely. Thanks, Kathy!

From our friends at CHURCHMOUSE YARNS AND TEAS: "Studies advise you to create boundaries within your home -- your bedroom is for rest, your office is for work, the den is for board games and movie nights, etc. -- to not only increase comfort, but productivity as well. Why shouldn't the same principle apply to your studio or knitting nook? Setting aside a special spot for creativity could not only boost inspiration and efficiency, but make making fun." We love this idea! We'd love to hear from you about your favorite knitting spot, and, don't forget we will be launching five new patterns from CHURCHMOUSE on Thursday, May 2, 2019, a couple of which we will be knitting out on the deck this summer (our spot)...

*** KATHY'S BOXES & RIBS SCARF ***

Kathy came up with this snazzy textured design, inspired by a vintage '70s sweater pattern. The lovely wool & bamboo blend makes the pattern stitch look fresh and new...

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS: 8" X 64", after blocking

SIZE: Adult's Medium

GAUGE: 22 sts / 30 rows = 4", after blocking

MATERIALS: approx. 375 yards DK weight yarn (suggested yarn HiKOO Sueno, 2 skeins); US size 5 (3.75 mm) knitting needles, tapestry needle for finishing

NOTES: Always slip first and last stitch on wrong side rows with yarn in front (wyif) and as if to purl.

Boxes & Ribs Pattern Stitch (stitch detail shown lower right, multiple of 4 sts)

Row 1 (right side): K3; *p2, k2; repeat from * across to last stitch, k1.

Row 2: Slip 1, p2; *k2, p2; repeat from * across to last st; slip 1.

Rows 3 - 10: Repeat Rows 1 & 2.

Row 11: K.

Row 12: slip 1, k2; *p2, k2; repeat from * across to last stitch, slip 1.

Row 13: K1, p2; *k2, p2; repeat from * across to last st, end k1.

Row 14: slip 1, p across to last st, slip 1.

Row 15: K3; *p2, k2; repeat from * across to last st, end k1.

Row 16: slip 1, p2; *k2, p2; repeat from * across to last st, slip 1 wyif.

Rows 17 - 20: Repeat Rows 11 - 14.

Abbreviations : k - knit; p - purl; wyif - with yarn in front; st(s)-stitch(es)

Repeat rows 1 - 20 for pattern.

DIRECTIONS:

Cast on 44 sts. Set-Up Row: slip 1, p across to last st, slip 1.

Work in Boxes & Ribs pattern until piece measures approximately 64" or desired length, ending with Row 10 of pattern. Bind off in pattern.

Block to measurements.

OPTIONS: Scarf can be made wider or narrower by adjusting the stitch count. Add or subtract in multiples of 4 to adjust width. Yarn may be varied heavier or lighter, changing needle size and stitch count.
