This is the time of year when our weather can be not-quite-cold but not-yet-warm and sometimes messy. We are looking ahead to warmer days with our knitting needles and crochet hooks in hand. Spring is in the air, so get started now. Make your dream projects a reality with these top picks for you...

Maybe it's the appeal of a one-skein small commitment project or maybe it's our Laurel Highlands weather, but our customers' fascination with hats of all kinds continues. Kathy's latest textured design, "Anne's Seed Hat" (\$5.00, shown upper left), looks great on everybody! Instructions are given for knitting flat (back and forth) and in the round (circularly), in both traditional and slouchy versions, sized from child to adult. The hat pattern will also soon be available to download at Kathy Zimmerman's Ravelry Store. For this hat, Kathy chose HiKOO "Sueno Worsted Tonal" (\$19.95, 100 grams, 182 yards, 80% merino superwash wool / 20% viscose from bamboo, CYCA #4). This worsted weight Peruvian yarn is a lovely blend of soft superwash merino and viscose that's made with strength and wearability in mind. The perfect amount of springiness makes knitting with it a pleasure. "Sueno Worsted" is perfect for socks, sweaters, accessories and hard-wearing garments that will last a lifetime. Also available in solid shades (\$17.50)...

It's no secret -- we love gadgets! The new CLOVER Swatch Ruler and Needle Gauge (\$10.50) is a multi-purpose tool for knitting and crochet. Measure your crochet hook or knitting needle in metric, US, and Japanese standard sizes. The swatch ruler allows you to isolate a section of your work to easily count both stitches and rows in a pre-cut 4" ruler. We also have received automatically-retracting CLOVER 60" fiberglass spring tape measures (\$7.50), featuring both inches and metric scaling...

BERROCO "Millefiori Light" (\$15.50, 100 grams, 350 yards, 50% wool/50% acrylic, CYCA #3) takes all of the shimmer and shine of its worsted weight sibling "Millefiori" and condenses them into a sport-weight version that's perfect for spring. This lightweight blend of wool and acrylic comes in vibrant shades. This yarn is an ideal choice for spring wraps and ponchos like multi-directional *Adriana* (pattern free with purchase of yarn to make project) or CHURCHMOUSE CLASSICS *Easy Folded Poncho* (a great take-along project). And, BERROCO YARNS are on sale...

MRS. CROSBY loves to play with yarn! Her collection of lovingly curated yarns are hand-dyed in beautiful variegated and semi-solid colors. New spring shades of "Steamer Trunk" (\$19.95, 100 grams, 164 yards, 100% superwash merino wool, CYCA #4) are here -- Bacalar, Nolan, Carnival, Sierra Gorda, Beauregard, and Harper. Whether you're knitting, crocheting or weaving, this yarn will bring a playful feel to your work and joy to your fingers...

Life is about using the entire box of crayons, so add some color to your stitching this spring. "La Jolla" (\$31.00, 115 grams, 400 yards, 100% superwash merino wool, CYCA #2) from BAAH YARNS comes in a beautiful selection of vibrant, saturated hues made in the USA. The firm tight twist to this yarn works up nicely in any kind of pattern. This yarn's superwash merino content lends itself to a variety of projects like socks, shawls and baby / children's garments. The March colorway with complimentary solids is shown in the photo lower right, along with our recommended project, *Teka-Teki* by Talitha Kuomi. This lightweight poncho is knit flat in two pieces and then joined at the tips of the herringbone stitch pattern to create rows of open circles. The openwork circles can be worn running across the shoulders (shown in photo of pattern) or can be work vertically at the center front and back. Spring perfect...



\*\*\* MORE GREAT NEW STUFF \*\*\*

We premiered Kathy Erhard's *Zebra Fade* design to rave reviews at the recent Pittsburgh Knit & Crochet / Creative Arts Festival (\$5.00, shown upper right). Kathy is a master at slip stitch knitting and this design is no exception. *Zebra Fade* is worked with the same main color throughout, while gradually fading contrasting color from darkest to lightest. The beauty of this design is that it can be worn like a poncho or a cowl, making it very versatile. Kathy E knit her design in HiKOO "Sueno" (\$16.50, 100 grams, 255 yards, 80% superwash merino/20% viscose from bamboo, CYCA #3), a lovely DK weight available on our shelves in a wide range of lustrous solids. Lightweight artisan-dyed DRAGONFLY FIBERS yarns are well-suited to warm-weather knitting. New shades are here like Carolina, Daenerys, West With the Night, Blue Velvet, Cognac, and Airport Hot Sauce in your favorite fingering weight bases "Djinni" (\$34.50, 4.2 oz., 420 yards, 80% superwash merino/10% cashmere/10% nylon), and "Pixie" (\$25.50, 4 oz., 430 yards, 100% superwash merino single ply). DRAGONFLY dyes high quality knitting and crocheting yarns in deep, rich and sometimes crazy bright colors for your crafting pleasure...

Neutral shades of HiKOO "Concentric" yarn are here in gray and brown heathers (\$48.50, 200 grams, 437 yards, 100% baby alpaca, CYCA #4). This yarn gives you color gradients that are carefully designed by a team of color specialists! "Concentric" is made from four non-plied strands, which creates the distinctive color change. This yarn is wonderful for shawls and stunning in sweaters. It knits up at worsted weight, so get inspired and start knitting!

New-to-us shades of PLYMOUTH YARN "Select Worsted Merino Superwash" (\$16.50, 100 grams, 218 yards, 100% superwash fine merino wool, CYCA #4) just arrived. This fabulous superwash merino whose everyday wearability and luxurious feel make it perfect for projects for the entire family with a large array of colors. It's an economical choice with generous yardage on each skein, with the added benefit of machine washability and the warmth of wool! Soft to knit and wear...

Like its worsted-weight cousin "Modern Cotton", BERROCO YARNS "Modern Cotton DK" (\$9.50, 100 grams, 335 yards, 60% pima cotton/40% modal rayon, CYCA #3) has the same soft blend of pima cotton and modal rayon, specially twisted to insure that stitch definition isn't sacrificed for softness. With a delightful range of solid colors from neutrals to pastels, this yarn is a fantastic choice for warmer-weather garments that drape beautifully. It's also a great option for those who are sensitive to wool...

We have received notification that BERROCO YARNS and JAMES C. BRETT have made the mutual decision to end their distribution agreement effective April 30, 2019. We have re-stocked a large supply of "Marble Chunky" and "Baby Marble DK" as these have been very popular yarns with our customers. BERROCO will continue to fulfill our customer orders throughout April, but availability is not known beyond that...

*Cable Channel* is knit in one piece with simple seaming and features a button closure to allow for easy washing and assembly. The front and back are knit in different stitch patterns to keep the project interesting and texturally charming. Both written and charted instruction, along with video support, are provided to guarantee success.

HiKOO "Kenzie" delivers the excellent stitch definition and durability best suited for casual luxury. Available in over 25 colors, there is a shade to match every decor or provide that perfect "pop" of color. We have just received a large selection of "Kenzie" yarn and have SKACEL buttons in stock. Be sure to purchase your supplies early to insure you get the shade and buttons you want.

Materials

- 4 skeins "Kenzie" by HiKOO (50% New Zealand merino / 25% nylon/ 10% angora / 10% alpaca / 5% silk noils). Michelle will be using #1024 Hokitika.
- US #6 (4.0 mm) 24" circular needles or size needed to obtain gauge
- 14" pillow form
- four 7/8" buttons

Colorwork can seem like a challenging task, but, luckily, instructor Karen McCullough will introduce you to a wonderful new knitting technique each month with panels from Michelle Hunter's *Building In Color* book. Don't worry about jumping in late -- it is never too late for the color series. Join Karen on Tuesday, April 2, 2019, 10:00 am - 12 noon to learn *Butterfly Stitch*, a novelty stitch that utilizes a simple technique to create intricate patterns. Cables make everything more attractive and lace patterns are no exception. Don't let working cables slow your knitting down by fiddling with a cable needle. Learn how to make left- and right-crossed cables without a cable

needle and discover how to make Michelle's shawl along with your other cabled projects fly off the needles. Students are using the gorgeous HiKOO by Skacel "Rylie" (50% baby alpaca/25% mulberry silk/25% linen) yarn, so see Kathy Z for this yarn or a suitable substitute and bring a size 5 (3.75 mm) 24" circular needle. Knitters can cable with confidence with "Rylie" as stitches stay in place if accidentally dropped off the needle. Fee is \$20 per class. Call 724-238-9320 to register.



Spirals of cascading traveling stitches and a contrasting cuff, toe, and afterthought heel give **Falling Dominoes Socks** their eye-catching appeal. Join instructor Kathy Erhard on **Saturday, April 20, 2019, and Saturday, May 18, 2019** from 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm at Kathy's Kreations to learn how to make these fun socks (shown upper right). April's class features knitting with two circular needles and cabling without a cable needle. May's class will take a look at afterthought heels, shaping the toe, and weaving in the ends. Please see Kathy Z. for the DREAM IN COLOR "Smoochy" sock pairings and two US size 1 or 1.5 (2.5 mm) needles. Class fee is \$20 per session plus purchase of the pattern (\$5.00). Rich colors of URTH YARNS' variegated and solid fingering weight yarns combine to make the **Butterfly / Papillon** shawl spectacular, while the clever use of short rows creates a butterfly wing pattern that might even impress Mother Nature. Learn tips and tricks to take your knitting projects to the next level with **Finishing Finesse**. Join instructor Kathy Erhard on **Saturday, April 27, 2019**, from 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm at Kathy's Kreations to learn the secrets to take your projects from "homemade" to "handmade" and become confident in your work. Please bring one of Kathy's Kreations worsted weight yarns and US size 7 (4.5 mm) or 8 (5.0 mm) to practice some techniques and call 724-238-9320 to register. Class fee is \$20...

\*\*\* HELPFUL HINTS \*\*\*

Make One (M1) increases can be confusing. For the left slant (M1L) and Standard M1: with left needle tip, lift strand between needles from front to back; then knit lifted loop through the back loop. For the right slant (M1R): with left needle tip, lift strand between needles from back to front; then knit lifted loop through the front. For purl versions, work as above, purling lifted loop.

Our knitting friend Eleanor Swogger tells us that, if you can't remember front or back for the slant, it may be simpler to work a yarn over on the public side of the work, knitting the yarnover stitch through the back loop on the wrong side to get the desired effect...



Here is our instructor Kathy E's trick for choosing yarn shades for her **Zebra Fade** wrap or other colorwork projects: Group shades together, then use your smart phone on the black and white photo setting to view them. This will tell you if there is sufficient contrast for the shades to be defined. If there is sufficient contrast among each shade of gray, then the yarns are a good choice...

\*\*\* STITCH MARKERS -- WE LOVE 'EM! \*\*\*

We've been inspired by our BERROCO YARNS monthly promotion and enjoyed reading a recent BERROCO "Knitbits" newsletter written by Amy P.



She writes: "Stitch markers are the little knitting lifesavers everyone needs." Anyone who has seen one of Kathy's works in progress knows that she thinks they are an essential part of every project! Amy's article goes on to discuss the types of markers and some wonderful ways to use them.

--- Non-removable: circular or triangular bits of plastic (check out our large selection of Clover and ChiaGoo brands)  
handmade sets of metal stitch markers with beads and a charm  
by jewelry marker Linda Cable designed for Kathy's Kreations (\$5.50, shown upper right)

"These stitch markers have to be placed on the needles as you're working. Many patterns indicate when to use them with the instructions 'place marker.' On the following rows, when you come to the marker, you slip the marker from one needle to the other to maintain the marker's position..."

Many patterns have you place stitch markers when you are working a series of increases or decreases, so you know at which point you'll need to work the stitches to make them line up nicely. Use them to cast on large numbers of stitches to ensure ending up with the correct number. Use them to separate our pattern repeats, so you know pretty quickly if you are off track."

--- Removable (locking) markers: these markers have an opening that "locks" into place such (Clover locking stitch markers or Bryson coilless pins)

"These markers work well for both knitting and crochet. These markers can be placed on the needles as you're working, but can also be placed in stitches themselves. Typically when you see an instruction to place a removable marker (as opposed to just 'place marker'), the patterns are letting you know that you're going to need to remove this at a later time."

"It's very helpful to have different colors of markers if a pattern calls for both removable and non-removable markers, Place a removable marker to help count the stitches, or to pick up stitches when you want to do it evenly. And, if you need to keep track of your work vertically, as in how many rows you've worked, they're great for that, too!"

\*\*\* MORE HELPFUL HINTS & SOME INSPIRATION \*\*\*

If your bound-off edge ends up too tight, try working again using a larger size needle. This will make the edge looser and provide more give...

Add a cheerful splash of spring color to any room by rolling leftover balls of yarn and piling them into a pretty basket or large clear glass container. Then just tuck into a corner or set out on a dresser or coffee table for an inexpensive decorative accent...

When working a cardigan, pick out your buttons BEFORE you start working the front bands. For best results, you will need to co-ordinate the size of your buttonholes with your desired buttons.

For added stability, try using a flat plastic button as a backing; sandwich the sweater fabric between and sew through both buttons. Avoid heavy buttons if you have a lightweight garment so that your sweater is not pulled out of shape...
