Fairy Lights creates a beautiful Fair Isle effect that you'll love to see build as you work. Great for Christmas socks or other holiday accessories in the colors of the season...

BERROCO classic superwash wool is bigger and better than ever with "Ultra Wool Chunky" (\$12.50, 100 grams, 145 yards, 100% superwash wool, CYCA #5). Knit and crochet projects work up quick as a flash with this bulky weight version of machine washable "Ultra Wool". "Ultra Wool Chunky" is delightful for thick and snuggly sweaters, poncho, blankets, hats and more...

Look no further than BERROCO "Aero" for ultra-soft, fuzzy goodness (\$15.50/cake, 50 grams, 164 yards, 65% alpaca / 28% nylon / 7% wool, CYCA #5)! This bulky weight yarn has a wonderful halo and will work up lightning fast, leaving you with a fabric that you won't want to put down. Self-striping, tonal color variations will give your project extra pizzazz without extra ends to weave in. "Aero" is perfect for making snuggly accessories or even a toy for your favorite little one. "Piave" cardigan model garment is on display...



*** MORE GREAT NEW STUFF ***

The most popular trend in knitting right now is lace weight mohair held together with a strand of hand-dyed wool. And for good reason! The fabric created is soft and luxurious and the color blends are endless!

Laura Dobratz of EMMA'S YARNS tells us about her design, *Cooma Cowl*, (shown right in color combo "Himalayan Salt", \$62.50 kit): "This cowl came to be after a need to swatch colors for one of the many popular sweater patterns that have popped up recently. I love to 'swatch with a purpose' and can always use a beautiful cowl at the start of the cold season -- especially one that is simple to knit and perfect for gift giving! This cowl knits up quickly with gradual increases from top to bottom and rows of single strands of mohair between double stranded sections to help it lay just right."



The pattern release and kit options for the mini-skein version are expected to be available here in early October. Kits combine mini skeins of "Practically Perfect Sock" with a matching skein of "Marvelous Mohair"...

A new-to-us knitting pattern is KNITTING PURE AND SIMPLE #292 *Neck-Down One Button Cardigan* (\$5.50). Using DK weight yarn, this V-neck cardie is perfect for ever-changing weather layering. We suggest HiKOO "Kenzie" tweed wool blend for this project...

The DREAM IN COLOR September Pop-Up Sock Club was inspired by fruity delicious sangria (\$34.50). The yarn base is machine washable "Smoochy" 85% superwash merino / 15% nylon and includes a 420 yard Sock-It skein and 100 yard Sock-It mini skein. We have the perfect "yummy" pattern to try with this -- KATHY ERHARD DESIGNS *Falling Dominoes Socks* (\$5.00 pattern)...

Love to knit or crochet kid's stuff? A remarkable new precious baby-safe yarn has arrived from ZITRON /SKACEL COLLECTION, "Gesa & Flo" (\$11.50, 25 grams, 99 yards, 100% virgin wool, machine wash gentle, US size 2 - 4 knitting needles). This yarn, with its 16 micron rating, is amazingly soft, making it an excellent choice for baby projects or anything else where the goal is softness against the skin...

WOOL ADDICTS BY LANG "Respect" (\$13.50, 50 grams, 154 yards, 42% merino wool/ 30% alpaca / 28% nylon, CYCA #4) is a lofty, airy, chainette yarn with the softness of merino, the warmth of alpaca, the durability of nylon, and a fluffy touch. This natural fiber is rustic in character, with captivating qualities inside and out. LANG YARNS are distributed in the USA by BERROCO, and we are always glad to special order any of their yarns for you, as well as to check availability and "special order" fibers from any of our suppliers, as well as our needle / gadget vendors...

BERROCO YARNS "Sesame" (\$16.95, 100 grams, 230 yards, 43% wool / 39% acrylic / 9% cotton / 9% nylon, CYCA #4) works wonderfully in simple lace patterns, as you can see in this stunning asymmetrical shawl *Carob* by Amy Christoffers (\$6.00, Ravelry Pro download available through Kathy's Kreation, shown lower left). *Carob* begins with the narrowest point and works out to the widest point making the sizing easily customizable. "Sesame" is a colorful self-striping yarn with a subtle sheen. Wool, acrylic, cotton, and nylon all come together for a colorful yarn flecked with color and texture. The fibers take the dye differently, producing a marbled effect. Pop your finished knit or crochet creations into the washer for easy care, making this a great choice for sweaters and projects that will be washed often. Ask to see our sample model shawl...

*** UPCOMING KNITTING CLASSES (call 724-238-9320 to register for all classes)***

Our knitting class series based on books by Michelle Hunter and taught by instructor Karen McCullough continue during this month. *Building With Lace* continues **Tuesday, October 1, 2019; 9:30 am - 12:30 pm**. Class registration is \$20.00 for the class plus purchase of book and yarn from Kathy's Kreations. AND, improve your knitting skills one square at a time with *Building Blocks*, designed to help knitters navigate through major knitting techniques and principles. The recommended yarn is HiKOO "Simpliworsted", a lovely blend of superwash merino and premium acrylic/nylon that is very soft and durable. We continue the series with interpreting *Charts*. The design was chosen specifically to increase your pattern reading skills and learn to "read" your work. The next session is scheduled for **Tuesday, October 1, 2019, from 1:00 pm - 3:00 pm**. Registration fee is \$15.00 plus purchase of book and yarn from Kathy's Kreations...

In our ongoing series of lace classes, students will master lace knitting one section at a time as we follow along with Michelle Hunter's *Building With Lace*. Join our instructor Kathy Erhard as she demonstrates the required skills and work along to make your own gorgeous lace shawl as a wearable showcase of your skills. Our next class is scheduled for **Saturday, October 5, 2019, from 9:00 am - 12 noon** at Kathy's Kreations. It's not too late to join this group and take your lace skills from casual to experienced as the series continues.

This month's *Building With Lace* class explores two lace patterns: one with the rich tradition of Estonian lace knitting and the other that adds beads to lace. Estonian knitting patterns are known for their raised stitches that resemble small bobbles known as "nups." We will also learn how to add sparkle and shine with beads. Students are using the gorgeous HiKoo by Skacel RYLIE (50% baby alpaca, 25% mulberry silk, 25% linen) yarn, so see Kathy Z for this yarn or a suitable substitute and beautiful MIYUKI 6/0 glass beads. Please bring US size 5 24" circular needles and a .95 mm crochet hook. This class has students working on various sections of the shawl, so you are welcome whether you have started your shawl or not. Class fee is \$20 per session.



*** UPCOMING CLASSES, continued (call 724-238-9320 to register) ***

Socks constructed with a toe-up design eliminate the dreaded Kitchener stitch with the added benefit of less leftover yarn. Join instructor Kathy Erhard on **Saturday, October 5, 2019, from 1 to 4 PM** at Kathy's Kreations for **Toe-up Sock Construction Techniques** and learn the Turkish Cast On, Fleegle Heel and Tubular Bind Off as used by Andrea Mowry in her comfy *Tuku Honey Socks*, a DREA RENEE KNITS design (shown upper right). There will not be sufficient time in class to complete a sock, so we will be creating a class sample demonstrating the techniques. The pattern calls for 75 (85, 105) grams fingering weight yarn and US size 1.5 (2.5 mm) and US size 0 (2 mm) 32" circular knitting needles. Kathy's Kreations yarn and pattern purchase are required. *** PICOT BIND OFF ***

A picot bind off is a charming way to add some flair to an edge, particularly on a shawl. While it does take more yarn and a little more time to complete than a "usual" bind-off, it is pretty and stretchy. It does not require any unusual manipulations with needles and yarn, just basic knit stitches and yarn-overs. This bind-off looks best on the right side (public side) of the work, so for best results bind off stitches after you've finished a wrong side row. Use this technique for socks, sweaters, headbands, blankets, scarves and shawls.

- step one: knit 1 stitch.
 - step two: make a yarn-over and knit the next stitch.
 - step three: insert the tip of the left-hand needle into the yarn-over and the stitch that is at the right side of the yarn-over. Pass the yarn-over and the right stitch over the left stitch and off the needle = 1 stitch remaining on the right-hand needle.
- Repeat steps 2 & 3 until you bind off all stitches.

*** SWATCHING TIPS FROM KATHY ***

As knitting expert Evie Rosen once told us: "Trust me, swatching is important!" Failing to swatch properly can result in a disaster, particularly with garments. You spend a lot of time and energy working on your project not to mention the cost of your materials, so invest a little time into making a swatch. Manufacturers typically offer a recommended gauge on the ball band, but this is only a suggestion. Look closely at your knitted fabric on the swatch to see if this is your desired effect. You may get the gauge with a different size needle but it may not be appropriate. A fabric that is too loose will stretch with laundering and one that is too tight will be boardy and uncomfortable to wear.

The old adage, "Take time to save time, check your gauge" rings true for a reason. We all experience "start-itis", want to cast on immediately and delve into a new project when creative inspiration strikes. Swatching before casting on a project gives you a chance to familiarize yourself with both pattern stitch and yarn. Kathy recommends that you block or launder your swatch (use the same blocking technique that you'll use on your garment) before checking the gauge to troubleshoot any pitfalls or problems. Make a larger gauge swatch, **at least 5" square**, to give a more accurate measurement. This is especially important when making a garment.

It's important to knit your swatch with the same needles that you will be using for your project. If one type of needle doesn't work out, try the same size in another type of needle (ex., bamboo vs. metal vs. graphite).

After you have determined your gauge after blocking, re-check your gauge every couple of inches after starting your project, in case it changes as you get into the project with a more comfortable rhythm...

*** RIBBED FINGERLESS MYSTERY MITTS ***

It's fall -- that time of year when the air is a bit crisp in the morning.

SIZE: Adult small / medium (large in parentheses)

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS:

Hand circumference: 6" (7")

Length: 7" (8")

YARN: DK weight yarn 150 (200) yards; suggested yarn DREAM IN COLOR "Cosette DK"

NEEDLES: US sizes 4 (3.5 mm) and 5 (3.75 mm) double-pointed needles / your preferred choice for working in the round (9" circ; FlexiFlips, two circs or Magic Loop) OR SIZE NEEDED TO OBTAIN GAUGE

SUPPLIES: small stitch holder or coilless pin

GAUGE: 26 sts / 28 rounds = 4" over rib pattern using size 5 (3.75 mm) dpns

TAKE TIME TO SAVE TIME, CHECK YOUR GAUGE!

STITCH PATTERNS

2 X 1 Rib (multiple of 3 sts)

Round 1: *P2, k1; repeat from * around.

Repeat round 1 for pattern.

MITT DIRECTIONS (make two)

With smaller needles, cast on 39 (45) sts. Join, being careful not to twist work; place marker for beginning of round. Work in 2X1 rib for 1". Change to larger needles. Work in pattern until piece measures 6 (6-1/2)" from beginning.

Thumb Opening

Next round: Work 9 (10) sts in rib pattern, place next 5 (8) stitches on hold; cast on 5 (8) sts, continue in pattern to end of round. Continue to work in rib pattern until piece measures 6-1/2 (7)" from beginning. Change to smaller needles. Work in pattern for 1".

Bind off in pattern.

THUMB

Place sts on hold back onto smaller needles. Attach yarn and work in 2X1 rib as established over 5 (8) sts. With free needle, pick up and K 1 st through the back loop along the side of the thumb opening, pick up & rib 5 (8) sts in the cast-on sts above thumb opening, pick up & K 1 st through the back loop along side edge of opening: 12 (18) sts. Divide sts evenly spaced on dpns. Work in 2X1 rib as established for 1-3/4 (2)". Bind off in pattern. Weave in ends.

ABBREVIATIONS: k- knit; p - purl; st(s) - stitch(es)

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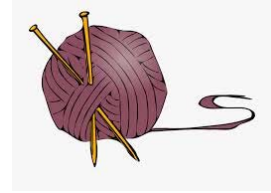
*** FALL FASHION TRENDS ***

*** SPRING BREAK WORKSHOP 2020 ***

Registrations are still available for our 9th annual Spring Break, to be held **April 17-19, 2020**, at Kathy's Creations, hosted by Kathy Zimmerman. We are delighted to announce that Jolie Elder of Mableton, GA will be our featured instructor. We first met Jolie at the 2019 Pittsburgh Knit & Crochet Festival, where her classes received rave reviews. And now, we are bringing her to Ligonier!

Jolie has explored a wide range of needle arts after learning to cross stitch at the age of four. She designs, teaches, spins, and "stunt" knits in the Atlanta area where she dymystifies the obscure. She has served on the boards of the Atlanta Knitting Guild, North Georgia Knitting Guild, Southeast Fiber Arts Alliance, and Center for Knit and Crochet. She has been published in *PLY*, *Spin-Off*, and *Cast On*. She is a nationally-recognized knitting instructor, having taught at Stitches, Georgia Fiber Fest, Maryland Sheep & Wool, and a variety of fiber fairs and guild knitting retreats.

Jolie's "cleverest un-vention" is a method for working stockinette-based laces reversibly, which she calls "Versa Lace". She will be presenting a 9-hour weekend workshop on how to convert stockinette-based lace patterns into reversible lace patterns based on 1X1 ribbing. Class projects include the *Juniperus Ficus Scarf* (photo shown upper right) and the *Alacrity Fingerless Mitts*. Topics covered include double-increases and double-decreases, as well as casting on for tubes and for center-out circular shawls.

About *Juniperus Ficus Scarf*, Jolie says: "This is a basic reversible lace. It uses 1X1 ribbing, double yarn-overs, and both left-leaning and right-leaning reversible decreases. The pattern begins with one-color Italian Cast-on and ends with a tubular bind-off. The stitch pattern is a four-row repeat."

About *Alacrity Fingerless Mitts*, Jolie says: "This luxury one-skein project uses reversible lace to create warm and elegant mitts. Worked from the top down in one piece, you can knit until you are almost out of yarn, leaving little waste. Mitts can be worn with cuffs turned up or down. Since they are completely reversible, the directions for the left hand and right hand are identical." Skills we will learn with these mitts include: tubular cast-on in the round, 1X1 ribbing, reversible centered double decrease, reversible centered 5-into-1 decrease, bridge, and tubular grafted bind-off. Ask to see our shop model mitts, knit with DREAM IN COLOR "Cosette".

The weekend package includes an after-hours Soup & Sliders party and special shopping time at Kathy's Creations (Friday evening); an informal meet & greet on Friday evening to get acquainted; an optional Friday evening knit-along; morning coffee breaks and two lunches at the Ramada; classes Saturday and Sunday; extended lunch break on Saturday with time to shop in the pretty little town of Ligonier and goodie bags (includes yarns for both class projects). Registration is \$250 per person. Overnight lodging is not included and is optional for local participants. The Ramada has set up a special rate for us, so please make your own reservations by calling 724-238-9545. *** NEW USES FOR OLD THINGS ***

Karen McC found this "sweater dryer" tip in a vintage magazine: Don't wring out your freshly hand-washed sweater. That will twist and stretch the fibers. Instead, lay the garment flat on a towel and go over the knit with an old-fashioned rolling pin (working from center to edges) to gently push out the water.
